Life without Oil or Natural Gas

Imagine the United States stopping all exploitation and production of natural resources that give us affordable sources of energy. Our daily lives would be so very different.

Without oil or natural gas the world would be drastically different than the world we know today. At the core of our energy consumption, oil and natural gas are used as building blocks for thousands of products used every day. Very significant changes would be felt throughout all lifestyles A world without these resources would require significant changes to our lifestyles and result in a higher cost of living.

We will watch a couple videos at the July meeting. Think of what it could be like to deliver a baby in a hospital or go on a date without being able to use petroleum-based products. Or getting ready for your jobs every morning. Doesn't sound very appealing!

Thousands of products that rely on oil and natural gas as building blocks would not be mass-produced; this includes chemicals, plastics, and fertilizers, among others. Oil and natural gas are resources necessary to produce everyday household items such as cleaning products, clothing, and food. Construction materials like asphalt and tar would also be impacted, drastically affecting infrastructure development or maintenance.

We would see significantly higher cost of energy without a supply of oil or natural gas. They provide the majority of our energy sources and are critical to maintain the global energy grid. Renewable energy sources such as solar and wind power would need to be vastly increased and implemented to replace oil and natural gas. But the investment and implementation of these technologies will almost certainly result in a higher cost of living and would take years to implement on a global scale. And, no matter how much energy wind and solar provide, they won't give the world affordable pharmaceuticals, clothing, cooling and heating, and a myriad of everyday items. Yes, we can use natural fibers such as cotton, linen, and flax but they need fertilizers and technology to remain affordable to grow, process, and convert to wearable/useable items.

I think we can all agree that a world without oil or natural gas would be very different than this, where live today. We'd see an enormous ripple effect across numerous industries if we lose petroleum-based resources. We would lose modern conveniences we take for granted – who wants to live without telephones, cars, trains, and wrinkle-free clothing?

6/26/2024 - US states sue government over forcing companies to pay for dismantling old equipment - Three southern states have filed a lawsuit against the Biden administration's proposed rule requiring oil companies to cough up billions of dollars. Texas, Louisiana and Mississippi filed a lawsuit on Monday against the US Government to stop the Biden administration's proposed rule forcing the offshore oil and gas industry to pay almost \$7bn in financial assurances to cover the expense of dismantling old infrastructure. 6/14/2024 - US oil refining capacity rises for second year in a row - U.S. crude oil refining capacity rose 1.5% to 18.38 million barrels per day (bpd) this year, a government report showed on Friday as a major new expansion in Texas boosted capacity. The Energy Information Administration (EIA) said the figures indicate capacity online as of Jan. 1, which reflected for the first time the startup last year of an about 250,000 bpd expansion to Exxon Mobil's, opens new tab Beaumont, Texas, refinery. The gain was a second year in a row of increases due to expansions at existing operations. Still, processing capacity at the start of 2024 remained more than 500,000 bpd below the 2019 peak of 18.98 million bpd, which came before a wave of plant closures and conversions during the COVID-19 pandemic. 6/11/2024 - Further GOM hydrocarbon upside potential on the horizon as initial drilling ops show promise - While the intermediate logging of an exploration/appraisal well in the U.S. Gulf of Mexico is said to have confirmed high-quality, hydrocarbon-bearing sands in upper target sections, the U.S.-headquartered oil and gas exploration and production player, LLOG Exploration, still has several deeper targets to spud. 
