



Santa Glitter Mimosa recipe

Ingredients

1 oz cranberry juice

1/4 tsp edible glitter (red, silver, or clear work best)

3-4 oz your choice of chilled champagne, prosecco, sparkling water, ginger ale, or sparkling apple cider

Optional: Festive frosting/sprinkles or sugar for the rim

Optional: Fresh cranberries and a rosemary sprig for garnish

Instructions

Pour cranberry juice into the glass and stir in edible glitter until dispersed.

Slowly add chilled sparkling wine on an angle to maintain bubbles and swirl the glitter.





Disclaimer: Per Google, Yes, edible glitter is safe if you buy products specifically labeled "edible," as they use food-grade ingredients like sugar, cornstarch, and mica-based pigments, but you must avoid craft glitter or anything only labeled "non-toxic," which can contain harmful plastics or metals. Always check the label for an ingredient list and confirmation that it's meant for consumption to ensure you're not using decorative, non-food items.
